

With three football fields, four baseball diamonds, six soccer fields, a walking and equestrian trail, and covered playgrounds and barbecue areas, Los Alamos Hills Sports Park in Murrieta is a welcome addition. The community celebrated its grand opening last Saturday.

The park, at Los Alamos Road and Ruth Ellen Way, just east of Interstate-215, encompasses 45 of the 86 contiguous acres there that the city owns and has slated for park development. The remaining 41 acres will be developed later.

The Temecula Valley Young Marines opened the ceremony by raising the American flag near the California state flag and the POW/MIA flag which were already on display. Three sky divers, one of them sporting an American flag parachute, landed on one of the fields. City council members were on hand to cut the ribbon.

"The skydivers were awesome," said Murrieta resident Rhonda Maxwell, who had a booth at the event. "I came out today to support Pop Warner. Maxwell, who is a financial consultant with A. G. Edwards & Sons, Inc., is a Pop Warner sponsor. Her booth was offering information on her professional services.
